In house, we have been working on improving our advertising and marketing capabilities. We were graciously offered the services of Hathaway Cinematics. Zach, the owner, has created professional headshots, staff photos, and interviewing some of our coordinators and recording their processes. The goal of these videos (to be released soon) is to create awareness about family homelessness but educate the holistic approach that Family Promise provides. As a team, it was eye-opening. We struggled with questions like, what could we have done to them feel better? More welcome? At home? Supported? Loved? Did we not listen because we were rushing around our selves? How could we improve our processes? Our communication? Our kindness? What if it was our own family was in their situation?

The team consensus was we need to remember our families are going through the hardest day of their life, **every day**.

Sure we provide a roof over their head and take care of the rest of their needs, but every day they get shuttled around. Every day they are not in control of their journey; every day, they have someone telling them what to do or asking for a recap on what they did do—every day.

So if they are quiet when they arrive, maybe they got the tenth NO about a job or housing application. Perhaps they got in trouble with their boss because they were late again because the bus wasn't on time, or maybe their Case Manager said they need to complete tasks on their to-do list to stay in the program.

FPGC Bridge Apart

Our Board of directors is a passionate group! After extensive thought, discussion, (and prayer), in the next direction Family

Promise would take, we are excited to announce a new program that will enhance how we help families in our community.

Our Bridge Apart program provides funding, up to \$1,000, available to families who meet specific criteria.

These funds can cover expenses like rental deposit, first-month rent, vehicle expenses, etc. Paying these expenses make it possible for families to move into permanent housing within 45 days, which is substantially faster than our traditional model, which can vary between 60-90 days.

Often the biggest barrier for our guests to maintain both employment and sustainable housing is a reliable vehicle. This program will allow us to help those families graduate faster and get to rebuilding their lives.



More good news!

Family Promise and the National Association of Realtors® (NAR) recently announced the launch of Keys to Good Tenancy, a responsive curriculum that provides families with the knowledge and skills to be good tenants.

The curriculum prepares new renters for tenancy by addressing a broad spectrum of elements, including budgeting, leases, home repairs, maintenance, neighbor relations, renters' rights, and more.

FPGC has teamed up with Shawn Rowden from ReMax Edge in Davison to help teach the curriculum. This program will be available to our current guest, graduates, and open to community members, beginning in September.

HELP US MOVE IN

The mission of Family Promise and Help Us Move In (HUMI) are very similar—they are working to raise awareness about the growing population of children experiencing homelessness and just like us—they are working on generating community support to create sustainable funds that help children and their families **maintain** stable housing.

We are pleased to announce that we are the latest recipient of this unique matching grant program. We have begun the work of reaching out to major local partner, and then together, we will challenge the community to match dollar for dollar funds that result in 4x the grant.

This will be our second step towards providing stabilization to those in need.



As part of their commitment to Affiliates, and families, Family Promise (national) teamed up with Capgemini, to create a workforce development video series with the goal of helping families be successful in today's job market.

This on-demand programming, will add another layer of skill development to add on to the services we already provide.

Pathways to Workplace Success, was created to empower families to secure not just jobs, but meaningful employment.

Capgemini created and fine-tuned these videos with the support and input of the Affiliate Council, the Guest Advisory Council, and the national Family Promise staff.
